Overview:

Nurses must have a knowledge base of the basic rules of home care, including the conditions of participation, covered services, and a repertoire of service-driven, and patient-oriented interpersonal skills, as well as the ability to pay incredible attention to detail, multifaceted skills, flexibility, ability to assume responsibility for the patient and POC.

Initial visit, identification and use of appropriate *Nursing Diagnosis*, planning and follow through care is done. Nurses can directly affect the care as well as see the results of that care. Prioritizing and complex decision-making, makes home care practice unique.

The physical assessment the nurse performs includes: assessment of the level and type of care required. physical, functional, nutritional, emotion, psychosocial, environmental and support system needs, as well as a health history.

[If it is determined that the client does not meet the admit criteria the client is given information on other sources which may be able to assist their needs. At whatever point it is determined that GCHH is unable to provide services to the client, the referral source is notified.]

Assessment begins with the professional's first encounter with the client and involves the systematic collection of data regarding the needs of the client. The client will have a continuous and systematic assessment and evaluation of health status through the collection of retrievable data, which are available to all caregivers.

Planning incorporates findings of each assessment and use of collected data to formulate client care needs/problem list and plan for these needs to be met in collaboration with physicians and other disciplines.

Interventions are activities performed by professional during ongoing visits.

Evaluation of client's POC incorporates the collection of data at each visit and the professional's collaboration and communication with the physician and other disciplines.

Safety, the client will receive care and teaching to minimize the risk of environmental hazards and to eliminate risk of injury.

Education, all clients will receive individualized teaching and support based on the individual needs.

Discharge planning/teaching. the client will receive appropriate instructions and counseling based on assessment of continuing post-discharge needs.

Staff Competency. the Client will receive care by competent, qualified staff commensurate with the client's identified needs. The Professional care level of the staff is enhanced by specialty unit experience. Ongoing education, training, and continued employment in ICU, CCU, ER, and Dialysis augment the staff's knowledge of pertinent developments in client care and improve their competence.
